Summary of Station Comments

(*does not include online Vision/priorities survey)

Circulation

- Improve Transit
 - Mitigate CEQA VMT with transit service
 - Increase headways, increase service
 - Increase cross-town service
 - o More "Buzz" trolley service
 - o More transit options connecting to Riverside, San Bernardino, San Diego, Los Angeles
 - o Enhance access to train station
- More pedestrian amenities
 - Finish the CV Link
 - Increase lighting
 - o Increase shade
 - Safer intersections
 - Wider sidewalks/more pedestrian space downtown
 - o Improve safety
 - Fill sidewalk gaps on major thoroughfares
- Bikes
 - o Finish the CV Link
 - Close gaps between existing bike paths
 - Desire for more separated bike lanes
 - Improve bike path signage
 - Improve safety
 - Support and opposition to increasing bike infrastructure
- Vehicular
 - Traffic calming at specific locations (Ramon, Gene Autry, etc.)
 - Support for street widening and increased speeds
 - More electric vehicle charging infrastructure
 - More parking
 - More readable street name signs
 - Road maintenance
 - Better signage for trail parking

Housing

- Top 3 most pressing issues
 - Different or more types of housing options (27 votes)
 - Homelessness (23 votes)
 - Sustainable Developments (21 votes)
 - Remaining categories received 11 votes or less
- Support for:



- Low income/affordable housing (mentioned multiple times)
- Mid-rise housing development
- Mixed-use
- Multi-family
- Special needs/homeless housing and services
- High-density low-rise housing
- Replace Golf Courses with housing
- Densify
- Affordable housing and mobile home park preservation
- Limit impacts of vacation rentals
- Opposition to:
 - High-density

Land Use

- Protect and increase open space, parks, pocket parks (mentioned repeatedly)
- Improve park access in underserved areas
- Turn golf courses into public open space, rec areas
- Educational signage along Tahquitz Creek
- Revise hillside ordinance
- Maintenance, signage and parking for Hiking Trails
- Targeted higher density, walkable areas
- Address health and safety issues in Mobile Parks
- Enhance 5G infrastructure
- Preserve and enhance unique character of neighborhoods
- Green parking lots
- More mid-rise residential (like The Rowan)
- Expand north end (Indian Canyon to Hwy 62, North of 10)
- Integrate sustainability master plan into corresponding GP elements
- Enhance walkability through land use and tree canopy
- More housing (apartments and low-income)

Vision

- Recommended Additions:
 - Environment and diversity
 - Expand our boundaries
 - Monorail or cross-town freeway
 - Smoke-free city
 - Equality and Diversity
 - Mandate trees in parking lots
 - o Finish the CV link
 - Less resort, more resident focused
 - More open space
 - More bike lanes
 - Better traffic flow

 - o Focus on mental and physical health and well-being of the citizens of our community
 - o Focus on residents over tourists
 - o Foster diversified economic development beyond tourism
 - Future tech proofing
 - o More public art
 - More diversity
 - Focus on the neighborhoods that need help with beautifying the community of low housing
 - o Complete sidewalk network
 - Save some natural desert
 - o Reduce unnecessary turf on city space
 - More parks
 - Preserve night sky
 - Become a smoke free city
 - o Regulate "bird" bikes
 - o City-wide disaster preparedness
